### **Expectations**

- Student must spot clean pen everyday.
- Student must clean out pen completely at least every 10 days if not more depending on the steer.
- Student should wash and dry steer daily, to maintain a good coat.





#### Expectations

- Student must take steer out of their pen and walk/tie up everyday for at least an hour.
- Student must attend all showmanship provided by the booster club and Ag. Teachers.
- Student should be at the barn <u>EVERY</u> Thursday between 6pm-7pm to meet with the Ag.
   Teachers and weigh their steer.
  - This will help manage weight gain and help with any problems the student is having.

# ALL Barn Rules apply in the summer, you will receive strikes for any of the following things:

- If you have people other than your immediate family at the barn.
- If your animal is not properly taken care of, no/dirty water, not being tied up or let out to the pasture.
- Dirty pen.





# **Daily Routine**

- Feedings need to be 12 hours apart
- Fresh water must be given everyday
- Summer hours:
  - Every morning: about 2 hours
  - Every night: about 3 hours steers should be turned out in the pasture every night or every other night.
- School hours: Feedings should be 12 hours apart
  - Every morning: about 30 minutes -Steers should be turned out during the day, once it cools down.
  - <u>Every night</u>: about 3 hours
- You will have this project for 245 days
  - This includes Summer Break, Thanksgiving Break and Christmas
     Break.



#### **Initial** cost

• Barn rent: \$200

Cost of steer: \$2,350

Total spent: \$2550.00



#### **Feed**

- Purina PRECON: \$15.99
  - Steer come in on PRECON
- Producers CO-OP Show starter-grower: \$11.00
- Producers CO-OP Show finisher: \$12.00
  - Every animal is different and will need different supplements and other feed additives
    - Powerfuel, Champion drive
- You will use at least 100 bags of feed = \$1800



# **Shavings**

- Price per bag: \$5.00 +/-
- You will use at least 200 bags = \$1,000







# Hay

- Price per bale: \$9.50
- You will use at least 40 bales of hay = \$380
  - Coastal Hay
  - Sudan closer to November or December



# Supplies

- Feed bucket: \$20
- Hay rack/bag: \$10- \$40
- Rope halter: \$5
- Show halter: \$45
- Show stick: \$25-35
  - May need more than 1

#### Misc.

- Joint supplements: \$80-\$110
- Shampoo and conditioner: \$12
- Wormer: \$20-\$60
- Brushes: \$5-\$10
- Show comb: \$12






# **Prospect shows**

- Entry fees ranging from \$30-\$120
  - It is very important you take your steer to as many as possible, so they are used to being on a trailer and in the show ring.
  - Last year we attended 8 as a group













#### **Grand Total**

- Grand total: \$6,000 \$8,000
- Depends on Vet. Bills & etc.

#### How much do steers sell for??

- Steers should sell at the CFISD show.
- CFISD show sells 10 steers up to 25 or 25% whichever is more will go to the premium auction.
- The average sale for steers at the 2017 CFISD Livestock Show was \$3575.00 (at \$2.50 per a pound).
- Freezer Sale is \$2.50 per pound.
